Hiking canyon with narrow passage at the exit

Hydrology:

Access: (machine translated)

On the N 203 from Nice northwards in the direction of Digne. After 20 km, turn right and take the D 2565 up the Vesubie. Via Lantosque you finally come up to Bollène on the right (26 km from the entrance to the valley of the Vesubie).\nAt the top of Bolléne, we take the first vehicle down to the left to the bridge over the Planchettes and park it where, at a bench on the left side of the road, the path comes up at an acute angle from below (marking "208").\n\nBack to Bolléne with the second vehicle and up on the left towards Col de Turini. After a few hundred meters, turn left towards St Sauveur and Prai. The tarred road becomes a dirt road. We park the second vehicle at the water tank.

Approach: (machine translated)

From here the path descends over the flat area. On the slope, a path descends quite steeply, apparently also used by horses. It meets a cross path that we follow until the bridge over the Planchette. Possibly, you can also come down to the creek earlier on the left.

Tour: (machine translated)

Beautiful hiking canyon on smooth rock. If you want to do the interesting narrows after the dam, you should take into account the water level. There are no belays, but they are not necessary at medium water. There is no need to rappel at the dam.

Return: (machine translated)

Either at the dam on the water pipe horizontally out to the old bridge or still through the narrows (worth it) and then up to the path. On the path in a westerly direction up to the road and the lower car.
