Summary: (machine translated) Short and easy rappel canyon in basalt rock with walking passages.		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) From the southwestern ring road around Dorgali, turn west directly at the supermarket 'Beretti', pass the cemetery and keep going slightly downhill until you reach the bridge over the Caddaris. About 50 m further on, in the widening of a left-hand bend, park the car on the right-hand side of the road.		
Approach: (machine translated) Take the slope behind the iron gate, after 50 m in the first left bend turn right and on a dirt road to the opening meadow. Keeping to the right (north) on this, descend over the fence to the streambed (rope in if necessary).		
Tour: (machine translated) 3 nice rappels, in between longer runs, partly on solid basalt rock. After reaching the Flumineddu, it is advisable to walk downhill in it first to the attractive passage where the Flumineddu flows between white limestone walls. Turn back at the root of the reservoir.		
Return: (machine translated) Was not easy to find in the past. After the mouth of the Caddaris in the Flumineddu, one went up in it for about 700 m until the next side valley cut in the eastern flank (Riu Stiporo). In the streambed of the side stream upwards. Sometimes. the streambed of the Stiporo was not clearly visible from the Flumineddu, because the water disappears under gravel banks at the edge of the Flumineddu and also no notch of the streambed is visible. One climbed up to below the rock wall. Here one had to traverse to the right (southward) to the rocky ridge and on this or in the hollow behind it up to the plateau. Here one met a dirt road and followed it, later the following track, back to the iron gate. In Corrado Conca (aaO) a shuttle is found as an alternative. Then there was apparently also an easier to find and shorter exit at the end of the canyon up to the right: http://win.aic-canyoning.it/forum/topic.asp?TOPIC_ID=1403&whichpage=3 (for a precise translation my Italian knowledge is not enough). All this is history after a dirt road was laid down to the Flumineddu, apparently to get the transported gravel out of the Flumineddu before it fills the reservoir. This dirt road starts about 1 km downstream from the mouth of the Caddaris and goes up to the right. This is a smooth and relatively pleasant way to get up to the tarred road. If a second car is available and the condition of the slope is suitable for driving, one could drive the second car downhill for the exit on the slope, possibly even to Flumineddu (see location map in the "photo gallery").
