**Summary:** (machine translated) River walk with smaller rappel.

### **Hydrology:**

Access: (machine translated)

(From Belluno) on the A 27 first towards Longarone, then continue on the SS 51 towards Cortina always up Piave. Past Ospitale di Cadore and through Rivalgo, the SS 51 changes after the hamlet of Macchietto to the eastern bank of the Piave. Here immediately turn right and head south through a small industrial area (Ansogne). At its exit park the car.

#### **Approach:** (machine translated)

From the parking lot, a path leads in a southerly direction to the ridge above the wide gravel bed of the Valmontina. On the left there is a large board (2012) that shows a sketch of the so-called Area Wilderness Valmontina (see photo!). Here is also shown our access via the "Percorso Escursionistico". We take the path on the northern slope of Valmontina and thus reach the footbridge over the orographic right tributary Bosco Bello. After the bridge we cross (partly with wire rope insurance) into this side stream and rope down into the Valmontina. If you continue along the circular route, you will reach the footbridge over the Valmontina (Pont de la Bigoza). Here you could directly enter the Valmontina, but immediately after this entry follows a narrow gorge part, about which so far no information is available (so possibly Explorer tour).

#### **Tour:** (machine translated)

Entry is via the last three rappels in Val di Bosco Bello, then march in the river with smaller rappels (max. 15 m) and possible jumps. The problem here is the generally abundant water flow (therefore not walked by the author). You can see the canyons just before the footbridge. It is also possible to reach the entry via Val di Cima Montagna in connection with Val di Bosco Bello (see description there).

#### **Return:** (machine translated)

CAUTION! At the supposed exit there is a shooting range (status 2022), it is best to stay further in the streambed and follow the access road to the road on the right after the huts of the shooting range.

Recommended is the full descent: Zima Montagna-Bosco Bello-Valmontina with start at 1400. For lovers of long days. From Bosco Bello onwards it is obvious how devastating these floods are. I.e. lots of boulders, walking, downclimbing but luckily also swimming, jumping, sliding. Final anchor in Valmontina is missing (we leave some emergency rope) but it can be overcome with a small jump from the boulder. Exit right bank up the scree, through the forest goes a small trail to the parking.

Valmontina is a beautiful great canyon with practically no dangerous narrow sections. There are a few jumps and smaller rappels up to a maximum of approx. 20m. It took us about 1h 45min from Bosco Bello. All abseiling points are equipped with rings and 10mm bolts. The higher points with 2 rings. (machine translated)
