Summary: (machine translated) Largely narrow cut rappel canyon		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) As for the Gnaupenloch: Coming from Innsbruck, we leave the A 12 at Zirl onto the B 177 in the direction of Seefeld, Garmisch (D). After about 2 km we also leave the B 177 via the exit Zirl-West. In this area the Hochzirler Straße begins, which we follow uphill past the Hochzirl train station to the Hochzirl regional hospital (3 km from B 177). Here, as far up as possible (1000m above sea level), park the car on the left side of the road.		
Approach: (machine translated) We take the "Welscher Weg" in the direction of Leithen in a northwesterly direction, but already after 100m we turn right uphill onto a forest road that was destroyed by a landslide a few hundred meters further on in 2014. The path leads moderately uphill until it suddenly bends to the NE at 1150m above sea level. Further uphill, at 1240m a.s.l., we see a small mule track turn off to the left. We follow it. It leads continuously slightly downhill, we pass a wooden footbridge and a hunter's stand on the left, then it goes down more steeply, partly in serpentine, until we reach the streambed. Our path deviates from the access description in the book by Riml/Amor. The latter leads to an entry above the dam wall, which we can see from our entry point about 100 meters further up the trail. If you feel like it, you can follow a path to the streambed above the dam in about 10 minutes.		
Tour: (machine translated) Immediately after the start, the stream gorges. Alternating running routes, rappel and downclimb. Again and again deadwood obstacles in the stream. In the meantime, the canyon becomes a bit more open. Where the Ursprungbach ripples down from the right, the tour comes to an exit.		
Return: (machine translated) Turn left onto the path that first leads downhill along the stream. At the slide brake it then leads up to the left and we come back to the "Welscher Weg" coming from Leithen. On this left, at a junction further keeping horizontally left, we come back to the car at the provincial hospital Hochzirl.
