Summary: (machine translated)

Short attractive gorge with only small rappels in the upper Buuschebach. Possibly plenty of dead wood.

Access: (machine translated)

As with Buuschebach, middle part with conversion I: We leave the A6/A8 (Bern - Interlaken) at Lake Thun via exit 18 (Lattigen) and drive up the Simme valley to Därstetten (almost 14 km from the highway exit). Via Weißenburgberg we come to a road branching off to the left about 3.4 km after the junction with the main road in Därstetten at an altitude of 1050m. After paying the toll at the machine, we continue on this road. We ride up the valley on an only slightly ascending road, past the ascent to the middle part, until we come to two directly following bridges over the Buuschebach and the Walalpbach coming down from orographic left in a left turn of the road. You can park your car to the left of the path before the first bridge (1115m altitude).

For information on how to do the middle parts of the route, see there, especially with regard to the maps and aerial photos. For information on how to do this if you only walk the Talberggrabe, see span. Map sketches (but not really worthwhile).

Approach: (machine translated)

We cross the two bridges and continue uphill along the road. First we walk about 150m to the southwest, then - after a hairpin bend - to the NNE and cross the Buuschebach stream on an airy bridge, later heading north along the canyon. We leave the forest and keep left across the adjoining meadow down to the stream (entry - see map). \n\nThere is also the option of avoiding the "approach" in the open streambed and roping in from the canyon rim via a tree at the start of the gorge at a footbridge that crosses the canyon here (see Spanish topographic view and corresponding approach sketch). But then you need 2x30m of ropes.

Tour: (machine translated)

The first step is a walk and downclimb (see above for side access). This is followed by a series of steps with smaller rappels. Towards the exit of the gorge there is a lot of dead wood in the stream. See also photos and video.

Return: (machine translated)

After the bridge, turn left up to the road and the car.
