Summary: (machine translated) A small but beautiful canyon. Ideal for practicing different techniques in the canyon, as there are many different stands within a short distance. The Torrent de Saint-Crépin can also easily be climbed twice in succession.		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) RN 94 between Embrun and Briançon, stop in the village of Saint-Crépin. Park near the cemetery.		
Approach: (machine translated) From the cemetery, walk uphill on the left-hand side of the river. Pass a water reservoir and follow a well-marked path in serpentines. Walk uphill to an altitude of 1250 meters. From here, leave the path towards the canyon by turning right at a green-marked tree. After a short walk between fir trees, a handrail leads to an abseiling point on a tree. Rappel about 15 meters, overhanging at the exit.

|#02| o MC | 2 short rope edges with fixed ropes from the tree on the left to the chain on the right

|#02| o Cascade 6.90 meters | chain on the right side

|#03| o Cascade 9.30 meters | chain on the left side

|#03| Optional Rappel Guide with 40m ropes if there is a lot of water

|#04| o Cascade 11.90 meters | chain on the right side, rappel in 2 steps with pool after 4 meters

|#05| o Cascade 7.20 meters | fixed ropes on the left

|#06| o Cascade 7.60 meters | Several anchors (some longer!) available

|#07| o MC | 3 meter rope traverse on the left side

|#07| o Cascade 9.80 meters | 2 anchors on the left side

|#08| o MARCHE+DES | A few minutes walk with several small downclimbs (maximum height: 2.60 meters)

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|#09| EXIT - emergency exit | Optional exit/entry on the hiking trail

Remarks

Beautiful, sunny descent offering a lovely view of the Durance.

This canyon is still called "Torrent de Saint-Crépin".

Canyon rarely flooded; with an "unsurprising" amount of water (visible from the parking lot).

It is possible to take a shuttle bus up to the hamlet of "Le Villard". In this case, the approach time is replaced by a fairly "vegetative" river walk of about ten minutes before arriving at the canyon proper.

Exit B to the corner of the cemetery, don't use this small (exit) path to enter the canyon. From point B climbing up is to steep and dangerous!
