Matériel: Cordes: 2x 125m outil de forage,		
Résumé: (traduction alternative) This canyon is characterized by a very beautiful view of the mountains and two impressive final abseils. The water quality is not exactly inviting.		
Hydrologie: Achtung, dieser Canyon kann sehr gefährlich sein. Er ist nur sehr selten begehbar, da nur selten Niedrigwasser herrscht (bestenfalls im September und November). Außerdem bewegt sich der Boden der Gumpen sehr stark, das Wasser ist schwarz, sodass man die Tiefe nicht abschätzen kann, und die Felsen sind rutschig. Alle unsere Bemerkungen sind also relativ, insbesondere was die Sprünge betrifft, von denen wir Ihnen abraten.		
Accès: D1091 nach La Grave. Zum Ausstieg: Parken Sie auf der Höhe von Les fréaux an der Parkbrücke an, die sich gegenüber dem Wasserfall von Le saut de la pucelle befindet und der alten Straße entspricht. Zum Einstieg: Fahren Sie hinauf nach Le Chazelet und dann wieder hinunter zur Brücke, die sich am Start des Teleskops befindet.		
Approche: (traduction alternative) Descent downstream: stop at the level of Les fréaux on the park bridge located opposite the waterfall of Le saut de la pucelle and corresponding to the old road. Uphill descent : Go up to Le Chazelet and then back down to the bridge located at the start of the telescope.		

Tour: (traduction alternative)

This canyon is divided into two parts: The first part is more or less an introductory descent, although the water movements can be very violent. This part is very aesthetic with a gulch that offers a view of the white snow of the Meije (great photo despite the backlight).

The second part is technically more demanding with large abseils. Rating TD+

The whole thing starts with a 300 m hike.

C 15 m (3 points (brooch, bolt + quickdraw, bolt)). Through large flow tree RD

2 waterfalls that de-escalate at low flow. At high flow there is 1 point each.

After the 1st part, it is possible to ascend back to Chazelet.

2nd part:

Waterfall 20 m, it is possible to make a small jump into the intermediate trough. The catch basin cannot be jumped over.

Waterfall 30 m (2 bolts and 1 pin) : Beautiful waterfall with a pinched block that siphons at high flow. The descent is irrigated. In the event of large volumes of water, uninstalled drains must be provided to reach the unstable rock faces below. It is usually possible to jump into the catch basin.

The next pool is skipped.

Chaos with siphons. A 5 m waterfall on a crappy rope ring exposed to high water.

2 waterfalls with possible jumps. 1 point to descend must be checked. (10 m rappel).

C15 m, Possible jump from 8 m into the broth with good attenuation (check beforehand).

C25m: Waterfall toboggan. Caution: if there is a lot of water, there are terrible siphoning chokes in RG and RD (flat rock jutting out 10 m to reach the water).

Large waterfall of 120 m: Difficult access to the relay. Plan equipment to get there in case of large amounts of water. There is a poorly visible RG spit to which we have added a quick link. The other points are jumped. Handrail from 10 meters to the relay.

Relay big waterfall: (3 points: 1 pin, 2 RG pins). Possibility to descend all at once with 2x120 m (little friction), but full juice. If you do not rappel 60 m, descend on the left bank, pass the hump and head above water into a chute that you can downclimb. At the exit of this chute on the right is a relay with two pins and a chain. All the equipment is outdated, Nov. 2006.

Commitment

Watch out for water movement in the first part.

Very engaged in the second part when water is present.

History

The first descent, and therefore the first equipment, was made by Pierre-Olivier Béal, who lives in Le Chazelet and runs the restaurant le Chalet des Plagnes in the same village.

Remarks

Beware, this canyon can be very dangerous. It is rarely accessible as the water is rarely low (at best in September and November). In addition, the bottom of the pools moves a lot, the water is black so you can't estimate the depth, and the rocks are slippery. All our comments are therefore relative, especially with regard to the jumps, which we advise against.

Secondly, the equipment is badly damaged by the flooding. It is intended for descents at low water.

We will give you some indications to estimate the amount of water. These are only suggestions. Your level should be sufficient to objectively assess whether the canyon is actually feasible.

Best: If you watch the Pucelle jump, several clues can help you estimate the amount of water. At the exit of the waterfall, you should see two small, clearly recognizable jets of water around a rock. Likewise, you should be able to see through the rock without difficulty. Secondly, there should be no water packet hitting the RG. Finally, the base must be occupied by a thin veil of water divided into several nets.

Maximum conditions: As long as you can see through the rock and no water packet is slapping against the left bank, it is possible to descend (also rare to find conditions).

Retour: (traduction alternative)

From the exit of the waterfall, you can reach the clearly visible parking lot via the path.

This tour with 2 locals gone, stands were in perfect condition. On the tour there is a waterfall with clamping block that should be abseiled in any case on the outside. Water level can be seen from below at the last 120m waterfall. By car or on foot (about 1 hour). Last waterfall can be divided into 2 parts, intermediate level on the left, protected from the main stream. Pay attention to rope friction and rope pulling. Very impressive tour with views of the 4 thousand :) (traduction alternative)
